

We have received word from Lou Shank that the hearing is to take place in the Florida Theatre Building, presumably in Jacksonville, at 10:00 a.m. Eastern Standard Time, August 10th, 1936. The information received from Lou Shank indicates also that the purpose of the hearing is twofold, first, to establish the cause of William Davis' death, and second, to establish his legal dependency.

We expect a rather lengthy written report from Shanks detailing his recent conversations in Jacksonville with L. B. Williams of Tuck Cleaners, Inc., after which we in New York will issue a summary report on the whole tragic affair.

I want to express my personal appreciation for your assistance in discussing various aspects of the incident with Ellis in Cincinnati recently.
