A. Spill Containment

1. Are your process areas completely paved
 with concrete to contain spills?

B. Spill Reporting

1. Do you have written guidelines for ^{e/}field
 personnel on spill and release reporting?
 (Brief examples of guidelines would be useful.)
 Are spills to concrete reported?
2. What mechanism is in place to determine if all
 spills or releases are reported to your environ-
 mental department? What agencies are notified?
3. Are all field personnel aware of what the RQs
 are for the materials you handle?
4. What type of spill reporting training do you
 have for your personnel?
5. What are your guidelines for determining or
 calculating if a spill or release is above the
 RQ?
6. Do you have any method of tracking or reporting
 spills or releases that are below the RQ?

C. Spill Prevention

1. Do you have written guidelines for field personnel on spill and release prevention? (Bring examples if possible.)
2. Do you have any procedures for categorizing the root cause of spills or releases; i.e. design problem, corrosion, human error, operational problem, mechanical problem, etc.? Which have been found to be the major root causes?
3. Are programs in place to address corrective actions caused by specific mechanical problems or root causes? Examples would be rupture disk training, SOP reviews and updates, personnel training and/or counselling, positive or negative incentives, etc.
4. Has any program or corrective action significantly affected (increased or decreased the number of spills and releases that you have recorded?
