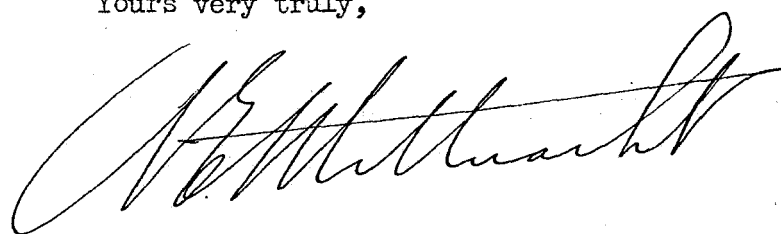
Dear Dr. Kehoe:

You doubtless will remember our friend Sam Cohn of the Independent Oil Company of Altoona. Under date of February 22nd he wrote us that one of the employees at their plant in Clearfield, Pa. (I presume a bulk loading point) was taken sick and was advised by two different doctors that his trouble was due to lead poisoning from the handling of Ethyl Gasoline. He did not know anything more about the case and suggested we have one of our field men look into it.
