COURT WATCH -- "White House slams 'egregious' ruling on sanctuary cities," by Cristiano Lima: "The White House on Tuesday rebuked a federal judge's decision to block a Trump administration directive aimed at stripping funding from 'sanctuary cities,' calling the court decision yet another case of 'egregious overreach by a single, unelected district judge.' Earlier Tuesday San Francisco-based U.S. District Court Judge William Orrick blocked President Donald Trump's administration from enforcing a portion of its Jan. 25 executive order that would halt federal funding to municipalities that did not uphold federal immigration laws." <http://politi.co/2q4qyCn>
