2 So when you think of compensating for life,
3 what the figure that we are asking you for the
4 noneconomic damages for Mr. Wood's death, for his pain
5 and suffering that he had up until the time of his
6 death is \$3,450,000.

7 For number seven, the amount of money to be
8 assessed here for Rosanna Wood as a surviving spouse
9 of Nollie Wood as a result of his death, and some of
10 the things that the Judge has asked you to consider
11 with respect to that are how her life has changed.

12 I mean, basically she said that ever since
13 August of 1990 her health problems started going down,
14 but more importantly than that, she is without a mate
15 and now more than any time, any time she needs someone
16 there for her, even if it is someone to do the simple
17 things in life, not just necessarily going places, but
18 someone there that can open up a jar when she can't do
19 that, someone to talk to, to provide companionship for
20 her. She doesn't have that. She will spend however
21 many days or years that she has by herself.
