3 A No, that's exactly -- she -- that's -- she used to
4 give a report to go and justify her being there and she gave
5 a report of all the letters and stuff that she produced.

6 Q Do you have any reason to suspect that these
7 figures are in some way not accurate from Miss Duschek?

8 A They are accurate.

9 Q Okay. This particular report to the president,
10 for example, indicates that according to the Institute
11 records in the past 11 months, there were 4,224 prints
12 released, 1,386 letters of correspondence and 2,074 telephone
13 calls placed to members about Institute business.

14 A Does it say that? I'm sorry, telephone calls made
15 to personal friends.

16 Q Well, I hope not. Let me draw your attention to
17 this particular set of minutes. You are familiar with that
18 format, are you not?

19 A Yes.

20 Q If I could draw your attention to the back page at
21 the bottom there?

22 A Uh-huh, yes.
