Harbor Bill Indorsed
OCEANSIDE — A bill to facilitate the financing of harbor improvements by smaller cities has been indorsed by the Oceanside City Council.

Mayor Erwin Sklar will go to Sacramento Wednesday to testify on behalf of the bill, which was introduced by Sen John J. Hollister (D-Gold).

The bill would allow creation of small craft harbor districts and permit issuing of revenue bonds by districts. It also would permit districts to levy a maximum tax rate of 75 cents for each \$100 of assessed value.

Sklar said present state law prohibits the use of revenue bonds for construction of small craft harbors. Oceanside plans construction of a \$3,300,000 refuge harbor on 60 acres of federally owned land at Camp Pendleton.

July 4 Parade Set

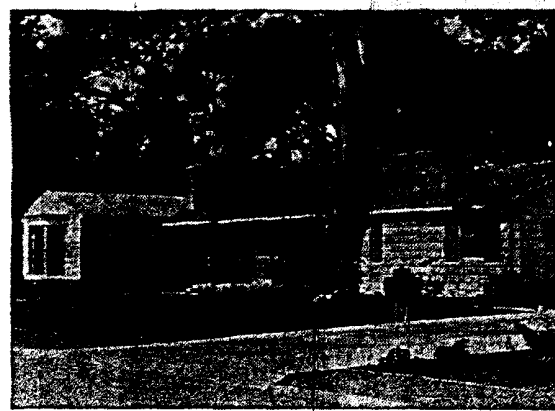
Addressing a Los Angeles College assembly, Mosk said alcohol and narcotics
