Enclosed is copy of OSHA's regulation pertaining to asbestos dust exposure. As a manufacturer the regulations require that a label reading as shown below be affixed to products that during any reasonable foreseeable use will release asbestos fibers in the air.

CAUTION
Contains Asbestos Fibers
Avoid Creating Dust
Breathing Asbestos Dust May Cause
Serious Health Harm

Our legal department has determined that the labels do not have to be applied to "40", "disc pads", and "disc AIO Kits", because it is not contemplated they will be ground before use. Labels should be affixed to "drum AIO Kit" and "S-40" brake shoes because it is contemplated they will be ground before being used. The grinding will release asbestos particles in the air.

Would you please approve affixing the labels as required by OSHA regulation.
