Herewith, report of orthopedic examination made at this office on 3/10/70:

PRESENT HISTORY: On 6/3/69 hitting metal and a piece flew into l/lower arm.

MEDICAL: F/A on D/A - went to Dispensary, exam; next day went to Overlook Hospital, Summit, x-rays; 2 days later saw Dr. Raffman, Madison, x-rays; 6/7/69 adm. to All Souls Hospital, Morristown, surgery by Dr. Raffman, hospitalized 1 day.

Lost 1 day from work.

COMPLAINTS: Pains off and on mainly in winter.

PHYSICAL FINDINGS:

The petitioner is a well developed, well nourished, adult male.

LEFT FOREARM:

On the radial aspect to the radial side of the dorsum at about the junction of the middle and distal thirds, there is a transverse, difficult to discern, operative scar (about 3 cm. by less than .1). There is no tenderness. He indicates that at times he has some discomfort distal to the scar. There are three, small, healing, superficial, lacerations or abrasions of the radial aspect of the wrist.

At the wrist, dorsiflexion and deviation slightly incomplete, palmar flexion complete. He complains of some discomfort at the extreme of ulnar deviation.

Motion at the elbow complete without discomfort. He is noted to have small, subcutaneous nodules scattered over the upper extremity.

X-rays of the forearm by Dr. Scovron on 3/10/70 with a lead marker over the scar revealed no radio-opaque foreign body in the soft tissue in that region. There was a tiny metallic foreign body in the soft tissues on the medial aspect of the forearm.

A report from Dr. Raffman dated 6/16/69 indicates first treatment 6/7/69 for injury of 6/3. Under history "a piece of steel flew off and landed in my left forearm". Under diagnosis "two pieces of steel foreign bo

embedded in the muscles of the left forearm". He indicates x-rays by him on 6/7 reveal the foreign bodies.

A report from a doctor whose name I cannot decipher, dated 7/6/69 indicates first treatment 6/5/69 for injury of 6/3. Diagnosis "small laceration on dorsum of left arm". He indicates x-rays at Overlook Hospital reveal "deeply embedded foreign bodies".

An x-ray report from the Overlook Hospital dated 6/4/69 with respect to the left forearm indicates "at least two small, metallic-like densities in the soft tissues of the distal 3rd of the forearm, one adjacent to the radius and the other adjacent to the ulna. On the frontal view, there is an open safety pin on the film presumably a marker with the point of the pin almost in line with the metallic fragment on the radial aspect of the forearm".

Incidentally, in the report from Dr. Raiffaah, under treatment, he indicates in part "excision of steel foreign bodies from left forearm".

DIAGNOSIS & CONCLUSION:

Based upon the history and taking into consideration the above noted medical information, the petitioner sustained a penetrating injury of the l/forearm with a small, retaining, metallic foreign body as a result of the June 1969 incident. Thereafter, removal of the metallic, foreign body was accomplished.

Taking into consideration the results of examination together with the above noted medical information, I would suggest that you consider payment to the petitioner permanent disability of about 3-1/2% of the left hand.

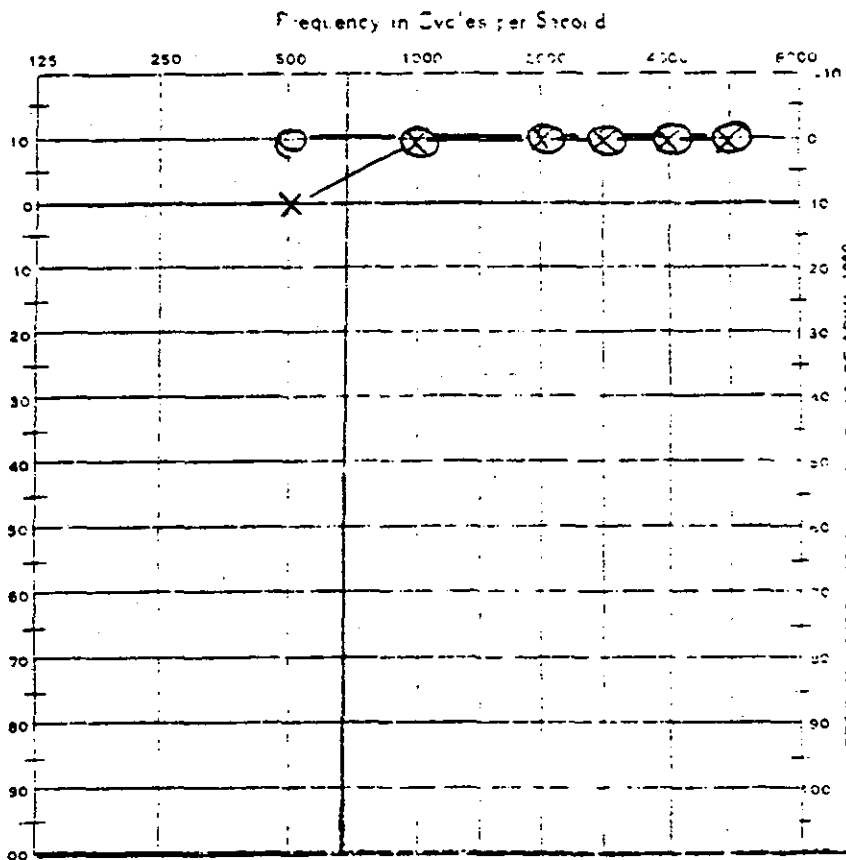

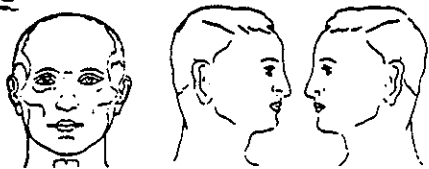
