I am writing to implore you to move forward with regulations banning the sale of methylene chloride. This "paint thinning" chemical is banned in other parts of the world and is deemed too dangerous to use by the Defense Department. I can think of no reason to delay this step.

I have spent years working in a highly regulated industry (aviation). I understand what's reasonable and what's a stretch. And I understand the administration wants to reduce regulations. I've often argued against unneeded regulation.

People have literally been hurt and died because of this chemical, including a friend of my son's. There are plenty of safer alternatives. There is no reason to delay. The administration is well ahead of its goal of reducing two regulations for every one new one. Please do this.
