Dear Charlie:

I am sending you herewith a copy of a letter from Mr. Michler's office transmitted to me through Mr. J. Goux of the New York office of Ethyl Gasoline Corporation, together with my reply which I think you will find self explanatory.

It would appear that the plant in San Antonio ought to be revamped to some degree to take care of the additional business. Whether this requires a new mixing plant or new storage tanks is not for me to say, but I think it will be entirely clear to you. If I can be of any further assistance to you in any way, do not hesitate to call upon me.

Having returned from my vacation a short time ago, I found your letter of August 6, concerning the change in the medical staff at Barranca Bermeja, Colombia.

I shall write to Dr. Ovalle in the near future when I can get my other correspondence cleared up. I would appreciate it very much if you would write him directly sending him copies of the regulation booklet and the Spanish translations for his own use, if he requires it, and more particularly, for his assistant, Dr. Gracia. I had a letter from Dr. Cruz Coke, dated August 19, trans-

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mitting to me his very great thanks for the subscription to the Journal of Industrial Hygiene and Toxicology, which is a gift from the Associated Ethyl Company to him. He seemed to be very appreciative, and I am sure it will be a very useful journal for him. He said that he had been elected Senator for Santiago in the recent elections, but that it would not effect his work in the Laboratory. I hope he is right about that, and I also hope for his sake that the "little revolution" of which he spoke will not materialize.

Please convey my very kindest regards to your family and accept as always my best wishes to yourself.
