If samples are selected, please remember that we should use containers which have not been contaminated with lead. It is my belief that perhaps our Manufacturing Department at Baton Rouge might be of some assistance to you although, as you will note, Dr. Kehoe has offered to send them chemically clean containers if it is necessary.
