

Will Pay Dealers For Summer Trips

Summer trips to famous vacation spots became a possibility for the 1177 Tribune Boy Dealers with the announcement today of the opening of the fourth annual vacation trip contest.

First prize in this year's event, to be presented the three top boys in the contest, is a 22-day tour of the United States. Included in the itinerary are three-day stops in New York City and Washington, and Gray Line tours of 14 other major cities of the country.

Three other winners will go on a 14-day cruise through the Inside Passage to Alaska. Ten days in Glacier National Park will be given three others. A group of 40 will go to Catalina Island, 72 will spend a week in Yosemite Valley at Camp Curry and over 300 will be sent to Diamond-O Camp in the high Sierra.

No expense will be involved in any of the trips for any of the boys, even spending money being provided by The Tribune. Adults will accompany each group on its trip.

These vacation opportunities are not restricted to a given number of boys, as each Tribune carrier is to receive a vacation of a week at Catalina, Yosemite or Diamond-O for a certain minimum of contest points.

1000 HAVE BEEN WINNERS
During the past three Summers, The Tribune has made it possible for over 1000 boys to earn, through their own efforts, vacations of a week or longer to many vacation spots.

Six boys spent 21 days in Honolulu, three went on a 21-day tour of the United States, nine spent 14 days in Alaska, eight went to Glacier Park, three visited the Grand Canyon, 175 have gone to Catalina, 82 have spent seven days in Yosemite, 25 had vacations at Lake Tahoe and 750 attended Diamond-O Camp.
