Dear Dick -

The following is a list of the damages claimed by Purina as the result of the PCB contamination of fish meal discovered in July, 1971. This information should be useful in our discussions if we can agree, for settlement purposes, that Monsanto may have liability in connection with our claim.

1. Chows returned from dealers (Dealer price)	\$98,651.88
2. Trucking and freight incurred on returned Chows	6,632.61
3. Chow in plants - Inventory 470 tons	84,600.00
4. Expense incurred in laboratory analyses	19,857.00
5. Cost of disposition of Chows - returned and inventory	9,913.03
6. Profit on lost business 8,951 tons x 15.99 per ton	143,126.00
7. Claims paid: Ralph Bridges, Lexington, Georgia Dr. Hargis, Tulsa, Oklahoma	8,163.67 280.00
8. Claims pending: Wallace Hatchery, St. Petersburg, Florida	1,172.88
9. Miscellaneous Charge (Delmar)	640.48

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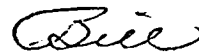
