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WASHINGTON, April 14.—President Hoover renewed his struggle with the national economic problem today by calling three financial chiefs of the government into conference with him at the White House.

They were Secretary of Treasury Miles; Eugene Meyer, Governor of the Federal Reserve Board; and Charles C. Dwyer, chairman of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation.

Mr. Hoover summoned the three men after a conference last night with the house economy committee.

The only one who spoke in opposition at the conference was Miles, who said they discussed the work of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation.

**Porter's Name
To Be Allowed
On Recall Ballot**

LOS ANGELES, April 14.—Mayor John C. Porter's name will be among those to be voted on when Los Angeles voters go to the polls in a recall election against the Mayor, the second district court of appeal ruled in a decision on this day.

The court, in handing down the decision, denied two petitions for writs of mandamus to compel City Clerk Robert Dominguez to keep Porter's name from the ballot.

Petitioners in their briefs contended that a provision governing recall election in the state constitution denied the object of a recall movement from automatically becoming a candidate for three years in the Los Angeles city charter.

Coincident with the ruling was the announcement of former Mayor George C. Carter that he would withdraw from the mayoralty race. This leaves nine candidates in the field besides Porter.
