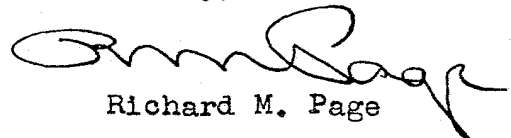
No copy of this letter appears to have been retained here, nor do I know by whom the same was referred to you, so at your convenience will you kindly forward a copy thereof to me.
