After giving it a quick stirring, pour the soft paste into a mixing bucket. It is now ready for tinting and final thinning.



Add tinting colors, drier, linseed oil and turpentine. That's all there is to it. Your pure white-lead paint is now ready for the brush.



Dutch Boy soft paste white-lead is the same strictly pure white-lead that you always get under the Dutch Boy trademark—but, instead of being a fairly stout paste, it is a soft paste.
