

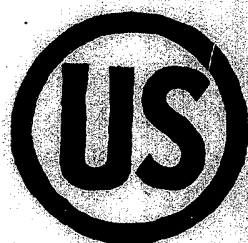
Another Record Broken

It seems that at every small-bore shoot of importance at least one world's record is established with US .22 N.R.A. long-rifle cartridges. It was so at the Olympics in France, at the National matches in Ohio last year, at Sea Girt this summer, and again at Camp Perry a few weeks ago.

The record broken with US N.R.A.'s at Camp Perry this year was that for the National Individual Small-Bore Championship at 50, 100 and 200 yards. The new record was made by T. J. Imler, of the Arizona National Guard, who shot the high score of 247 x 250. Such a performance is not only a tribute to the "holding" of Mr. Imler but to the accuracy of US .22 N.R.A.'s as well.

The National Individual Championship was but one of many matches in which these straight-shooting .22's featured. Forty-nine per cent of all prize winners in the small-bore rifle matches used .22 N.R.A.'s. Furthermore, seventy-five per cent of all prize winners in the pistol and revolver matches where commercial ammunition was used shot cartridges of US make.
