Note: The 5¢ rate applies to sales of pig lead in the United States and the 38¢ rate to production of pig lead regardless of where it is produced.

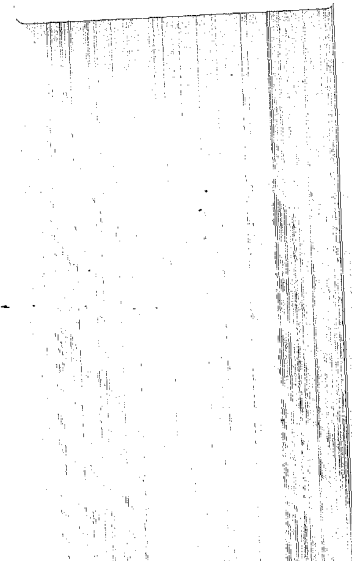
The attached statement is for the first quarter of 1963. The amount billed for Research is the actual amount for this purpose based on 1962 pig lead production figures which have already been filed with us. The same is true of Industry Development based on 1962 figures of pig lead sales in the United States. Neither are subject to later adjustment. The general membership subscription remains the same as for the last quarter of 1962 and will be adjusted at a later date when your 1962 tonnages for lead mined, smelted and refined, and consumed in manufacture are available. Yearly minimum subscriptions of \$200 for regular members and \$1,000 for foreign producers remain in effect.

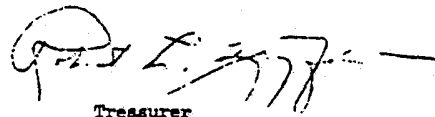
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SUBSEQUENT ADJUSTMENTS

In order that we may make the necessary adjustments in a subsequent statement, won't you please send us at your earliest convenience, if you have not already done so, your tonnages for the year 1962 on the following applicable classifications as marked:

1. Domestic lead mined (recoverable lead content only)
- 2. Lead smelted and refined in the United States
3. Lead consumed in manufacture of lead products in the United States
4. Lead consumed in manufacture of assembled articles in the United States (such as storage batteries, cable and ammunition)
5. Foreign lead exported to the United States (including ores, concentrates, bullion, pig lead, and lead products - lead content only).
