Dear Mr. Porter:

I quite agree with the feeling expressed in your letter of September 17th, both as to the consideration of our course in the cases referred to, and in the need for re-examination of the four men.

I should think it desirable to have them examined by Baton Rouge physicians, and then, in view of the reports of findings, to determine whether the opinions of other highly specialized consultants may be required.

I think, further, now that the origin of these cases is understood by the court, that we need not fear that our position with respect to the state of the plant and its hygienic facilities will be compromised by any settlement that can be made without further litigation.

I shall be in Baton Rouge during the week of October 14th and if these examinations could be completed before that time, we should have an opportunity to discuss the cases in detail.
