Dear Jack:

Some time ago you reported to me the method of handling shipments of ETHYL fluid made to mixing points in your division.

I have passed your letter along to Dr. Kehoe with certain suggestions and he has now been able to review the entire situation throughout the country with the result that he thinks we would be justified in requesting Florence and Glenrock to order shipments of ETHYL fluid in carload lots. We realize that 44 drums of fluid will last them for some few months but we are doing everything possible to absolutely eliminate any less than carload shipments because Dr. Kehoe considers such method of transporting the material as the most vulnerable spot in our system to eliminate health hazards.

We would thank you to please take this up with the proper parties and see that they take the necessary action to provide facilities and place their orders on this basis in the future.
