Dear Mr. Couchman:

Just a note of thanks for your valuable time and courtesies extended Mr. Schreyer and me last Tuesday in helping us with the Baltimore Label Ordinance in regard to paints containing 1% or more of lead.

This is to advise that all of our Exterior Paints containing 1% or more will carry the attached sticker on the lid of the container. The larger size is placed on our quart and gallon sizes, while the other appears on our pints and smaller size containers.

We have already taken steps to see that none of our Interior Paints containing 1% of lead metal will be shipped to dealers located within the limits of the City of Baltimore.

We have also withdrawn our Green Porch and Floor Enamel until such time as we have inserted a special sticker bearing the following statement:

"No recommendation on this label or otherwise is to be construed as indicating in any way that this product is suitable for use on interior surfaces of places used for the care of children or on interior surfaces of dwellings."

We will send you two labels with the sticker attached for your approval.
