Dear Mr. Gould:

We are enclosing herewith two copies of the examination record on your [REDACTED]. The complete report will be mailed to you just as soon as our analytical results are at hand.

As we discussed over the telephone this week, it is not possible at the present time to determine whether or not the previous lead exposure that Mr. [REDACTED] had is playing a role in maintaining his present state of ill health. It may be possible, however, to throw some light on the lead factor were this man to be hospitalized, placed on a diet, and his excretions studied for a period of two weeks or so.

Insofar as the question of liability is concerned, it would appear that the patient's illness is directly related and continues from his exposure to gases evolved while he was cutting in 1931. The prognosis on this case must be extremely guarded. While hospitalization and attempts at de-leading have benefited some patients, we feel that this procedure is decidedly in the experimental stage and that the chances of benefiting Mr. [REDACTED] by such a procedure are small. None the less, there is a chance which he would not have were nothing done.
