WEEKLY LETTER TO THE MAYOR

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In his WEEKLY LETTER TO THE MAYOR dated May 19, 1972, the Commissioner of Health wrote:

Dear Mayor:

Because of funds generously donated by Dulaney High School students, the Baltimore City Health Department is now supplying iron-fortified formula for babies in that section of east Baltimore served by the Comprehensive Children and Youth Project 606C of the Greater Baltimore Medical Center.

These funds became available because some senior students of Dulaney High School were impressed with a film "Poverty In America" shown in their social studies class. They set up donation boxes and held assemblies to encourage students to give to help the poor. A total of \$991 was collected and turned over to the Maryland Food Committee, a private, volunteer organization interested in better nutrition for the poor. The Food Committee chose to use these funds to sponsor the iron-fortified formula program of the Children and Youth Project at 1017 E. Baltimore Street.

Dr. Shi Shung Huang, director of the Children and Youth Project, explained he hopes to reach 100 to 150 children with the formula program. Babies are eligible if they live within the Project 606C area and are less than six months old. The formula will be supplied to these infants until they are nine months old.

Since the program began April 6, 25 babies have received the liquid formula, but Dr. Huang expects this number to increase quickly as more mothers learn of the formula availability. Mothers may obtain the formula at 1017 E. Baltimore Street any weekday between 8:30 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. A case of liquid iron-fortified formula usually costs about \$9 in Baltimore City. Mothers are asked to pay \$1 for the same amount and the money so collected is used to buy more formula. If anyone wishes further information about the iron-fortified formula program, they should call 828-2448.
