Thanks indeed for the fine tabulation you made up covering the above. As a result of this, I told the New Jersey Zinc Company we will attempt to ship out the entire 500 tons the last week in September but that, if we found it impractical to do so at that time, we would carry the balance over into early October, when it looks like we should be well out of the woods. Will you please be guided accordingly when I forward their orders down to you, which will be sometime within the next two weeks?

In this connection, inasmuch as they are very large buyers of zinc concentrates, they felt that such a designation on their orders and our invoices to them would cause considerable confusion. As a result, they have asked us to change this to Zinc Compounds #1, to represent Ozlo 18M, and Zinc Concentrates #2 for 1288. To this I agreed.

With regard to the bags, I find that they print all their own at Palmerton and, therefore, they will have to get plates made, which they are proceeding with immediately and will advise us shortly. Furthermore, the bags they buy for leaded zinc come from Bemis and have an outer ply of red craft paper with rough grip, in order to distinguish such packages from their lead-free zinc oxide bags. Therefore, they wish us to purchase this same type, which I told them we would be glad to do. If any premium is involved, please advise me later.
