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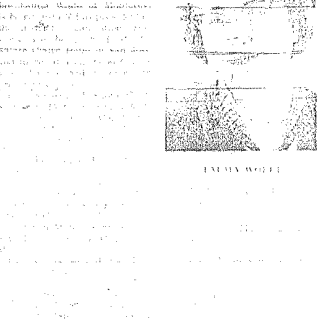

 Mrs. Scudder of Home, who has been in Monterey for some time, is now in the Monterey Marine Hospital. She is recovering from a recent illness.

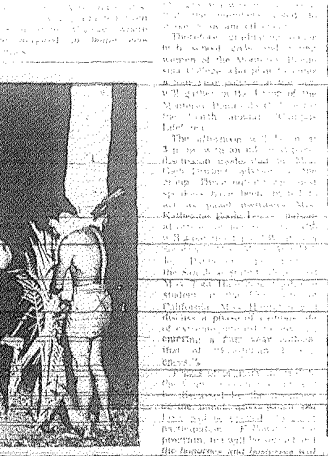
