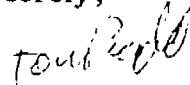

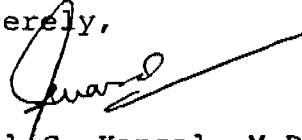
Dear Mr. Breyley:

CASE UPDATE REPORT AND CLOSURE SUMMARY:

I met with Mr. Price on May 14, 1986 to discuss his vocational plans and the options available for him from a rehabilitation aspect. We discussed alternative employment opportunities, part-time vs. full-time employment, retraining opportunities, his physical health and his present lifestyle.

Mr. Price indicated his physical condition restricts him from numerous activities. He tires easily and must rest periodically throughout the day. Mr. Price is very cautious with any physical activity and is hesitant to overexert himself physically. He spends his time gardening, enjoying his grandchildren, and bookkeeping duties for his church. He states that it is necessary for him to rest approximately every two hours when involved with the above activities. He expressed some concern that his driver's license was restricted and issued for six months, since he has been classified disabled.

We discussed the possibility of Mr. Price seeking employment and the pros and cons of full-time and part-time employment. However, Mr. Price indicated that he felt his physical condition would not permit him to work. We discussed his interests in real estate and electronics and the possibility of pursuing those interests vocationally. However, Mr. Price indicated that at one time, he checked into obtaining a real estate license through Kent State University, Ashtabula campus, however, he felt the class schedule of eight hours a day would be too demanding on him physically.

Mr. Price appears to have adjusted to his present lifestyle and presently is not interested in seeking alternative employment or job retraining. At this time, he states he is not physically capable of pursuing alternative employment or job retraining. Since Mr. Price is not interested in a work rehabilitation program or retraining, we are unable to provide rehabilitation services for Mr. Price at this time.

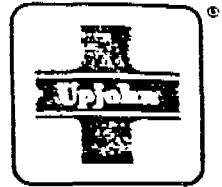

As reviewed in our last report of contact Mr. William Price has continued his participation in the physical therapy conditioning program at Ashtabula General Hospital under the supervision of Brian Schreck, LPT. At the time of my last report we were recommending the use of a stationary bike as part cardiovascular aerobic reconditioning program that had been designed for him. On 6/17/85 I spoke with Mary Custer via telephone and it was suggested that we rent this equipment for Mr. Price's use. After several telephone calls to several rental agencies and an inability to arrange in a cost effective manner for this equipment to be delivered to Mr. Price's home I again spoke with Mary Custer who asked that we purchase the needed equipment. It was agreed by all parties that Mr. Price would be allowed to use this equipment as long as necessary but it would remain the personal property of Gen Corp. Mr. Price has verbally agreed to this arrangement but I am suggesting that we obtain a verification of this agreement in writing. I will discuss this recommendation with you personally in the near future.

On 6/26/85 I received an initial report from Brian Schreck, LPT of Ashtabula County Medical Center which has been previously forwarded to you. This report outlines Mr. Price's physical therapy conditioning program which has been discussed in my previous reports of contact.

On 7/8/85 I telephoned Mr. Price but he was unavailable to speak with me. His wife informed me he was doing well and continued his participation in the physical therapy program. They were to leave Wednesday, July 10, 1985 for a three week vacation in Europe and will return on August 6, 1985.

On 7/16/85 I received the enclosed physical therapy report from Brian Schreck, LPT. As you can see by reviewing this report he is voicing some concerns regarding Mr. Price's motivation and compliance with this program. In my past reports I have discussed Mr. Price's hesitation to over exert himself physically due to a fear he will cause an exacerbation of his previous physical problems. As stated he has a follow-up appointment scheduled with his physician Dr. G. Thomas Budd, M.D. of the Cleveland Clinic in August upon his return from vacation. I feel at present Mr. Price is pre-occupied and anxious regarding this examination and the outcome of it. He is reporting an

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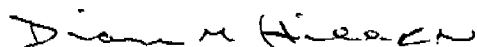
increase in left shoulder and upper back pain which is possibly due to the stretching exercises but his is apprehensive in this regard due to the fact that he experienced similar symptoms prior to the diagnosis of his cancer.

I have kept Dr. Budd informed of Mr. Price's participation in all rehabilitation planning to date. I will be addressing a letter to him including the two physical therapy reports prior to his examination of Mr. Price. Based on the outcome of his medical follow-up evaluation I feel it will be necessary to contact Dr. Budd and Mr. Price in order to re-evaluate future rehabilitation planning. If it is determined that Mr. Price remains medically stable it is my recommendation that a more aggressive physical therapy program be devised which could be submitted to the Industrial Commission Rehabilitation Division as part of a reimbursable rehabilitation plan. Based on Mr. Price's participation of a self directed aerobic cardiovascular reconditioning program I feel we would achieve better compliance in a more closely supervised setting. I can appreciate Mr. Price's hesitancy and anxiety regarding his physical well being, but I feel he will not improve his general condition and stamina unless he is involved in a more vigorous physical therapy exercise program.

I will be in contact with you in the near future to discuss future rehabilitation efforts on this client's behalf. I will wait until following his appointment with Dr. Budd to do this.

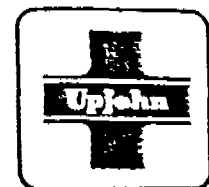
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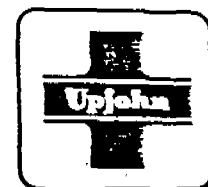

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Surveillance Notes Wednesday

Wednesday August 16, 1989.

Surveillance is instituted at the Price residence at 8:00am. The home is a two story single family with a well kept yard. A sign in the front yard indicates it is the Price residence. At this time no activity is noted.

8:46am a light blue sedan pulls into the driveway and a W/F and two children exit it and enter the residence.

8:53am The same female leaves the residence and departs in the blue sedan.

9:20am An individual believed to be our subjects leave the residence in a dark blue Buick Riviera. He is alone.

9:30am The subject arrives at the Big K restaurant at a unical gas station on RT 84. The subject enters the restaurant.

10:04am The same subject who is described as a W/M in his 50s wearing a blue golf shirt, blue jeans and glasses with thinning hair exits the restaurant and enters the buick. (SEE VIDEO)

10:09am The subject is followed to a pharmacy located on RT 193.

10:11am The subject exits the pharmacy and enters his vehicle.

10:30am Surveillance is reinstituted at the subjects residence. The blue Buick is parked in the drive and the garage door is open.

11:34am The subject exits his residence and gets into the blue Buick. He exits his driveway.

The subject is lost in traffic at 11:49am off RT 193. Surveillance is reinstituted at the subjects residence.

12:37pm The subject returns to his residence.

1:30pm the subject backs a light blue four door sedan from the garage.

1:33pm The subject carries a garden hose and a bucket from the garage and begins to wash the vehicle. (SEE VIDEO)

2:29pm The subject washes and dries the vehicle for approximately fifty five minutes continuously. He now finishes and pulls the car in the garage.

2:54pm The subject leaves his residence once again in the dark blu
