Dear Doctor Brennan:

I have returned to my permanent address in Cincinnati, and am now ready to have your Company's employee come along. I have consulted the Director of the Department of Internal Medicine, Dr. Richard Vilter, in the College of Medicine and the University Hospital - The Cincinnati General Hospital, on Burnet Avenue and Goodman Street, Goodman Street now being the entrance to the Hospital.

Dr. Vilter will arrange the necessary accommodations and will be in charge. We shall have to call in a neurological consultant, certainly. Others may be desirable, but we shall not go beyond the necessities of a proper study of Mr. Litchison's status. I shall look after the problem of lead.

I am assuming that you wish to have a definitive study of the case, with a well-established diagnosis. We will do, therefore, what is necessary, without going into any more elaborate tests and consultations than we believe to be required.

If you wish to specify any matters with regard to accommodations or any other matter, let me know.

I believe it will be satisfactory to have Mr. Litchison here next week, and, if possible, next Monday. That may be rushing matters, and I'll abide by your wishes. There has been enough delay, however, on our part, and I don't wish to delay further, any more than is necessary.
