The representatives of the Board of Economic Warfare and the Metals Reserve Company who have been negotiating with the Cape Asbestos Company and Turner-Newall in London, appear now to have virtually completed their negotiations and it is anticipated that a contract will be signed shortly. You were good enough some months ago to suggest that you might assist the Metals Reserve Company in the distribution of African asbestos to consumers in this country.
