Martin Frieday, Sr.

Oakfield, June 23.—Martin Frieday, Sr., 72, died at 5 o'clock this morning at the home of his son, Martin, Jr., of No. 28 Oak street. He had been in poor health for two years and seriously ill at the home of his son for three weeks.

Born in Germany on November 21, 1861, Mr. Frieday came to the United States when 19 years of age and had had resided at Oakfield for 32 years. His wife, Margaret Savage Frieday, died May 13, 1932.

Besides his son, Mr. Frieday is survived by four daughters, Mrs. William Moleski and Mrs. Anthony Novick of Akron; Mrs. Elizabeth Genesky and Mrs. Ross Anderson of South Alabama; three sons, Fred of Wheatville, Leo of Buffalo and Albert Frieday of the U. S. Marine Corp stationed in Shanghai, China, and 23 grandchildren.

Funeral services for Mr. Frieday will be held at St. Cecelia's Church at 9:30 o'clock Monday morning, the Rev. Francis Klep, rector of the church, officiating. Burial will be in St. Joseph's Cemetery, Batavia.
