NATURE OF EMPLOYMENT:

Claimant is now employed as a janitor in the Philip Carey Mfg. Co., Wayne Avenue, Lockland, Cincinnati 15, Ohio.

NATURE AND CAUSE OF O.D.

It is alleged that from the inhalation of asbestos dust over a period of thirty years, claimant suffered the occupational disease known as asbestosis.

AVERAGE WEEKLY WAGE AND
PERIOD OF DISABILITY:

Average weekly wage covering period of one year to the onset of O.D. is shown on OD-4.

Claimant is still working.

INVESTIGATION:

Clarence A. Hulette states he is sixty years of age, married, and now resides at 712 Wyoming Avenue, Lockland 15, Ohio and is employed as janitor in Building #27, a warehouse of the Philip Carey Mfg. Company. Claimant further states he began employment with the named company on June 12, 1928 as an asbestos worker; that he worked in the asbestos mill continuously up until 1953 when he was given a job as an elevator operator and was so engaged until December 27, 1954 when he was assigned to work as a janitor in Building #27, a warehouse. Claimant further states that in 1945 he became short of breath and sometime later filed Claim No. OD-47976 with the Industrial Commission of Ohio which was disallowed as he was not considered to be totally disabled; that he was cared for by Dr. Jacobs who practiced in Wyoming, being associated with Dr. J. S. Mathews; that Dr. Jacobs has moved from this state and is now residing in California; that he has recently been cared for by Dr. Mohr of Lockland, Ohio; that he is now extremely short of breath, has a steady persistent cough, has lost twenty-five pounds recently, and feels that he no longer can continue work of any nature; that he will journey to Columbus for a physical examination when so notified if he is able.

We visited Dr. Mathews' office. They have no record of treatment. We contacted Dr. Mohr and he states that he took one X-ray picture of claimant's lungs. Shortly thereafter he gave the X-ray to the claimant. We then recontacted the claimant and he states he does not have the X-ray film.

Might we suggest that this claimant be given a complete physical examination at the earliest possible time; that the company will make arrangements for him to appear for said physical examination when notified. This suggestion is also requested by John T. Cantlon of John T. Cantlon and Associates, Inc., Consulting Actuaries for the Philip Carey Mfg. Co..
