

1 But something happened in October of 1966.
2 Some guy from New England called, one of the union
3 guys and said, hey, my brother-in-law has been cutting
4 your Kaylo for 10 years, worked in a fabrication
5 shop.

6 What he did, he just installed -- because
7 what happens is a lot of times when you run a pipe,
8 you put it up, wrap it around and when you got to an
9 angle you cut it.

10 This guy's job was to go back in the
11 fabrication shop and just cut it after 10 years and he
12 said, you know what, I think I got asbestosis from
13 your Kaylo and we say okay. That is when we learned
14 about Kaylo.

15 Now, we had known in the past that other
16 types of asbestos products can cause asbestosis.
17 There were some workers' compensation claims made, but
18 these are people working with the TLVs, working with
19 raw 100 percent asbestos cement.

20 What did we do? 1966, late 1966, we put a
21 warning on our product.
