

WHITE-LEAD AS A BASE FOR ALL PAINT

WHITE-LEAD lends itself readily to the mixing of paint for practically all purposes. It is sold in convenient sized packages in all leading paint stores.

One of the special advantages of making paint from white-lead is that it can be colored to the exact tint you want, simply by adding tinting colors ground in oil. These colors-in-oil can be bought in small quantities where the white-lead is bought. Dutch Boy colors-in-oil are especially recommended for this purpose.

White-Lead can be readily mixed to produce a gloss or flat finish. Dutch Boy flattening oil is particularly designed to produce a durable, washable flat paint when used with Dutch Boy white-lead. Of course there are some who still prefer turpentine. However, white-lead is the base in either case.

For all-around general painting, the majority of master painters have found that white-lead is the most reliable paint pigment to employ in order to produce satisfactory results.
