Subject: LEGISLATIVE REPORTING SERVICE

## To Members of the Lead Industries Associations:

In order to enable ourselves to take action to forestall adverse and ill-considered state legislation on health, safety and related subjects, and to apprise our members of such proposals, arrangements have been made to secure the periodic State Legislative Reports issued by the Manufacturing Chemists' Association.

Negotiations are under way with the Division of Industrial Hygiene of the U. S. Public Health Service to obtain similar reports on proposed federal legislation.

The initial group of proposed state enactments of possible interest to our members, all on subjects of air or water pollution, are as follows:

- CALIFORNIA A. 16 Air Pollution. Creates air pollution research advisory council in state department public health and appropriates \$150,000. To Public Health Jan. 9.
- MASSACHUSETTS H. 406 Industrial Wastes. Resolve providing for study of disposal of sewage and industrial wastes in the Housatonic River Valley. To Public Health Jan. 3.
- H. 407 Industrial Wastes. Provides for study of disposal of sewage and industrial wastes in the French and Quinebaug Rivers. To Public Health Jan. 3.
- H. 934 Sewage Disposal. Provides for study of the disposal of sewage and industrial wastes in the Westfield River Valley. To Public Health Jan. 3.
- H. 1536 Pollution of Rivers. Resolutions memorializing Congress to appropriate funds for the elimination of pollution from the rivers, streams and inland waters of the Commonwealth. To Constitutional Law Jan. 3.
- H. 2669 Waste Disposal. Provides for study of disposal of sewage and industrial wastes in the Chicopee River Valley. To Public Health Jan. 3.
- S. 392 Disposal of sewage. Providing for a study of the disposal of sewage and industrial wastes in the Three Mile River and its tributaries in the towns of Dighton, Foxborough, Mansfield, Norton, Plainville, Rehoboth, Sharon and Wrentham and the cities of Attleboro and Taunton. To Public Health Jan. 3.



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S. 393 Disposal of Sewage. Resolve providing for a study of the disposal of sewage and industrial wastes in the Sumford River Valley in Foxborough, Mansfield and Norton. To Public Health Jan. 3.

NEBRASKA LB. 94 Water Pollution. Provides for state water pollution control under Health Department and naming of advisory committee. To Public Health Jan. 11.

NORTH DAKOTA S. 43 Water Pollution. Providing for state water pollution control and abatement program. To General Affairs Jan. 8.

OREGON S. 9 Air Pollution. Relating to air pollution; including provisions for administration and enforcement by the Sanitary Authority, and appropriating money therefor. To Public Health Jan. 10.
