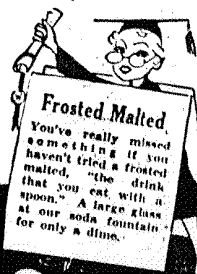

Professor Mears will visit Honolulu, Japan, and North China during the course of a seven weeks trip. It will be his first visit to the northern portion of China.

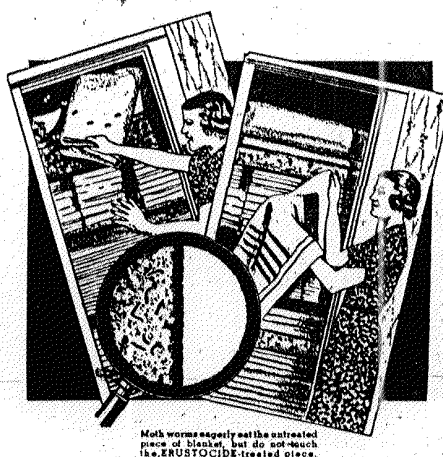
The trip is being taken as a rest cruise, according to Professor Mears, who will return here in time to take over the direction of the summer quarter work at the university. He is dean of the summer school.

Millbrae Votes Down Local Police District

Millbrae's experiment with an independent police district ended in failure yesterday when the electorate voted out of existence the system installed by the San Mateo County Board of Supervisors just one month ago.

A one-sided margin of 502 votes to 140 ended the brief police district system. Technical errors in the drawing up of the ordinance which created the district allowed the electorate to ballot on the question.

Three police commissioners, Gerald Lee, Donald Bennett, and E. V. Bjork, lost their posts when the election results were announced. Once again, sheriff's deputies from Redwood City will patrol the Millbrae area.
