

Repainting Outside Wood

Ingredients		1st Coat	2nd Coat
Soft Paste-white-lead	100 lb.	100 lbs.	
Pure raw linseed oil	1 gal.	8 1/4 gals.	
Pure turpentine	1 1/2 gal.	1/2 gal.	
Pure drier	1 pt.	1 pt.	
Makes	0 1/4 gals.	0 1/4 gals.	

Dutch Boy *soft paste* white-lead, contains more oil than the heavy paste—almost one gallon more in 100 pounds of paste—and calls for the use of about one gallon less oil in each standard formula. Allowance for this is made in the five formulas given in this folder. If a flat effect on inside wall work is desired, the heavy paste is to be preferred. The higher oil content of soft paste will give more of a sheen to surfaces painted with it.
