MEMBERSHIP

It was reported that Rock Wool Manufacturing Co. and Unarco Industries had requested membership in NIMA.

A discussion followed pertaining to the expansion of membership in NIMA to include residential types, foams, etc.

The advantages of expansion were cited to be:

1. Additional financial support;
2. Additional statistical information;
3. A larger segment of the industry represented;
4. Standardisation of test methods more easily accomplished.

The disadvantages cited were:

1. Loss of control of organization;
2. Health problems expanded.

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A motion was made, seconded, and passed, that

A Steering Committee be appointed to investigate ways and means to expand the NIMA membership to include all insulation.

A Committee consisting of Messrs. J. H. Boynton, Chairman, P. D. Kaley, and R. E. Maylor was appointed. The assignment is to be completed prior to the NIMA Spring Meeting.

Letters will be sent to Rock Wool Manufacturing Co. and Uarco Industries acknowledging their requests.

The letter of resignation from Forty-Eight Insulations was discussed. A letter is to be written to them asking reconsideration. M. Wilson is to talk to them in this respect.

HEALTH & SAFETY PROGRAM

Dr. L. B. Grant reviewed the proceedings of the Health & Safety Committee Meeting of December 11, 1968, a copy of which is attached hereto, and included the following:

1. Request received from L. Gralley to study the fibrous glass textile manufacturing plants;
2. Katterring study relative to testing fibrous glass duct liner and duct systems;
3. Research Proposal, from the University of California.

It was reported that the H & S Committee, by a 3-1 vote, recommends to accept the latest proposal which includes the insulation studies plus the duct studies and recommends the duct study be the first priority (Part II).

Dr. Grant advised that PFG Industries would not support Part II, as they believed it was an unwarranted expenditure of funds, and also believe Part I is more important.

4. Dr. L. B. Grant tendered his resignation as Chairman of the Health & Safety Committee, and recommended Dr. Jon Kouzon as Chairman.

Dr. Grant's resignation was accepted reluctantly.

The meeting was adjourned for luncheon, and reconvened at 2:00 P.M. to discuss the University of California proposal. The following were in attendance:

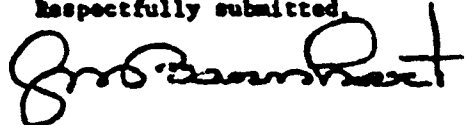
