The program is at present operating in the following counties: Contra Costa, Santa Clara, San Francisco and Alameda. The program is open to all women, irrespective of their residence, whose husband is an active service man in the fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh or eighth grades in the Army, Navy, Marine Corps or Coast Guard. Under the program, care and hospital maternity care are paid to the family. Care is provided throughout pregnancy and weeks after delivery as well as adjustment. Any infant under whose father is a service man in these grades is entitled to the event of serious illness.
