## Was Noted for Civic Welfare Activities

Adrian D. Joyce, chairman of the board of the Glidden Co. and a leader in civic and welfare activities for the last half century, died today at 82 in his home, 13901 Shaker Blvd.

Besides his office in the paint company, which has world-wide sales, he held numerous directorships in other business organizations.

Only a short time ago, Mr. Joyce returned from a six-week vacation tour of Europe.

Though active direction of the Glidden Co. had been handed over to his son, Dwight, who is president, the elder Mr. Joyce continued to go to his office daily. He spent his usual time there yesterday.

Mr. Joyce was born on an Iowa farm. His family moved to Michigan when he was a boy, and his first major employment was with Swift & Co. While with Swift he put the firm in the fertilizer business.

### Was School Teacher

At one time in his early life he was a school teacher.

He took charge of the Glidden Co. in 1917, building it to its present status of 38 factories doing a business of more than \$228,000,000 annually.

The firm branched into many lines, including insecticides, perfumes, and all types of paints and varnishes.

Among his other positions, he was or had been a director of the Cleveland Trust Co., Wheeling & Lake Erie Railroad, numerous paint and pig-

ment contribution to the city's civic welfare.

He is survived by his wife, Mary, his son, three daughters, Mrs. John H. Lathe, Mrs. John A. Duncan and Mrs. Clark P. Maxson. Six of his grandsons are associated with the Glidden Co.
