	S.118	Water Pollution. An Act concerning the depositing of foreign substances in lakes, rivers and streams. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened: Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to deposit or cause to be deposited, any foreign substances in any lake, river or stream which shall cause the death of any fish or water animals therein.
