Vinyl Resins Dusts

Dear Dr. Henson:

Periodically we get inquiries relative to the question of dust exposures to these products. We have always looked upon these dusts as inert substances because of their insolubility, and we do not feel they are capable of producing changes in the lungs.

On two occasions while I was plant physician at South Charleston, I had chest X rays made on all the employees exposed to these dusts in the vinylite units. These X rays were entirely negative. Will you please let me know if this group of men has been re-checked by X ray and if any evidences of changes have been noted in the same. Any comments you may wish to make relative to these exposures will be appreciated.
