COL. JOHN J. DOOLEY DIES

Col. John J. Dooley, special representative of the Company for many years, died recently at his home in Larchmont, New York, at the age of 80.

Col. Dooley joined National Lead in 1907 as a salesman and special representative for the U. S. Cartridge Company. In this capacity he gave instruction in shooting to state and municipal police and National Guard units all over the country. In 1916 he resigned and re-entered the U. S. Marine Corps to organize a school for the instruction of World War I machine-gunners. Following the war he became the second Marine ever to receive a commission as lieutenant-colonel in the Marine Corps Reserve.

He returned to the Company in 1921, serving as special representative until his retirement in 1938. Following his retirement, he was retained on a consulting basis for a number of years.
