Some time in the near future, I shall need to know, fairly definitely, whether or not our proposal for an investigation of the lung cancer problem has met with the approval, or at least, the interest of the group to which you intended to present it. I do not need to explain to you, I am sure, that we have to cut our cloth according to the actual pattern of our resources. From both experimental and practical viewpoints, this pattern is of unusual interest and concern to us, and I do not wish to take on other responsibilities that would make it impossible to pursue this work if we can undertake it. Any advice you can give me, with respect to the potentialities of this proposal as well as its time table will be greatly appreciated.
