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son was approaching him rapidly and that he paid particular attention to the behavior of the car because he felt he might "get into trouble" if his own car met the car driven by Tennyson.

2 DRIVERS TESTIFY

Other testimony offered in defense of the charges of negligence and carelessness brought against the city by Tennyson was offered by two ambulance drivers. Thomas Hannigan and Harry Robinson, both of Vallejo. They testified that when they arrived at the scene, after being called to pick up an injured man, Tennyson told them he didn't think he needed to go to a hospital. They advised him to submit to an examination and took him to a Vallejo hospital, they said. Hoberg, in describing incidents immediately after the accident had happened, said Tennyson regained consciousness after he and others had aided in removing Tennyson from the wrecked car. He said Tennyson began to talk about gathering papers and other materials which had been strewn around at about the time the ambulance arrived.

Mrs. Sharp's testimony for the plaintiff yesterday morning was concerned mostly in connection with letters and complaints purportedly made to Commissioners Frank Brew and E. J. Blanco regarding the condition of Fifth street at the point where Tennyson charges a perpendicular drop in the concrete surface of the road caused him to loose control of his car.
