JOSEPH H. REID ELECTED A COMPANY VICE-PRESIDENT

Joseph H. Reid has been elected a vice-president of the Company.

Mr. Reid began his Company career in 1927 with the St. Louis Smelting and Refining Division as a mining engineer. He was transferred to the Baroid Sales Division in 1936, where he became production manager. Mr. Reid came to the Company's general office in New York in 1941 and in 1947 was made chairman of the mining committee. In December of the same year he became assistant manager of the Titanium Division and in 1949 was appointed manager of the division. He was elected a director and member of National Lead's executive committee in February of last year. Mr. Reid is also a director of Titanium Pigment Corporation.

PROMOTIONS ANNOUNCED IN BAROID SALES DIVISION
