Dear Bill:

I have your several letters, including yours of August 20 on the correlation of supervision of uranium plants and the possibility that we might undertake this work. I shall give some thought to the matter and would like to discuss it with you further at a suitable time, for our present situation does not permit me to make a hasty decision in such an important matter.

I assume from the information available that you are attending the Saranac Meeting. I am set down on the program for some discussion on the animal experimentation. I intend to spend at least a day at the Meeting, and therefore this can be done, if desirable, but I question whether or not it would be to the advantage of Dutra, as well as ourselves, to have him enter into this discussion and to attend such part of the session as may be useful. In view of what you told me earlier I should be glad if you would give me your point of view on this point. Dutra is willing to go, but is not too keen about it, unless some really useful purpose will be served. Perhaps his mere acquaintance with the group is sufficient reason. What do you think?

I am sending you herewith a bill to cover the cost of the work done for Republic Steel at Warren, Ohio. I am a little bit vague about whether this should go to you or to them, but I send it to you in the first instance, with the idea that you can either handle it or return it to me with your advice. It appears that there may well be a final report to replace Cholak's preliminary report. If so, perhaps the bill had better be withheld until the final report is in. We should be glad to follow your suggestion on either of these points.

I had a splendid vacation, a good rest, some very vigorous systematic exercise, and some good fishing. The result is my waist-line is in a bit, my energies are reinforced, and I am glad to be back at work.
