Dear Mr. Schaefer:

I find my recent letter requesting the cardboard rules and regulations was unnecessary since I received the cards this morning. Thanks for the cards and for anticipating my wishes.

The examination of the cards has confirmed my statement that these cards are quite unsuitable for mixing installations anywhere outside of the United States. As a matter of fact, they apply only to tank car installations and they will work for a very significant misunderstanding of the rules and regulations if they are applied to drum mixing equipment. It is important, therefore, that these cards should not accompany any educator sets which go outside of the United States, and it is equally important that they should not go to any mixing installations even in the United States except those at which tank car equipment is in use. They will not do at all for drum mixing installations. This matter should be carefully checked into in order that no educator sets accompanied by these cards may go out in the future to drum mixing plants anywhere.
