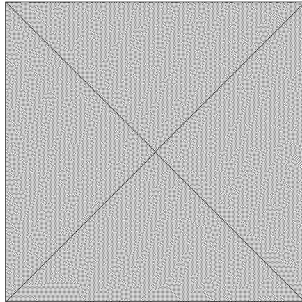


TOM WOLFE

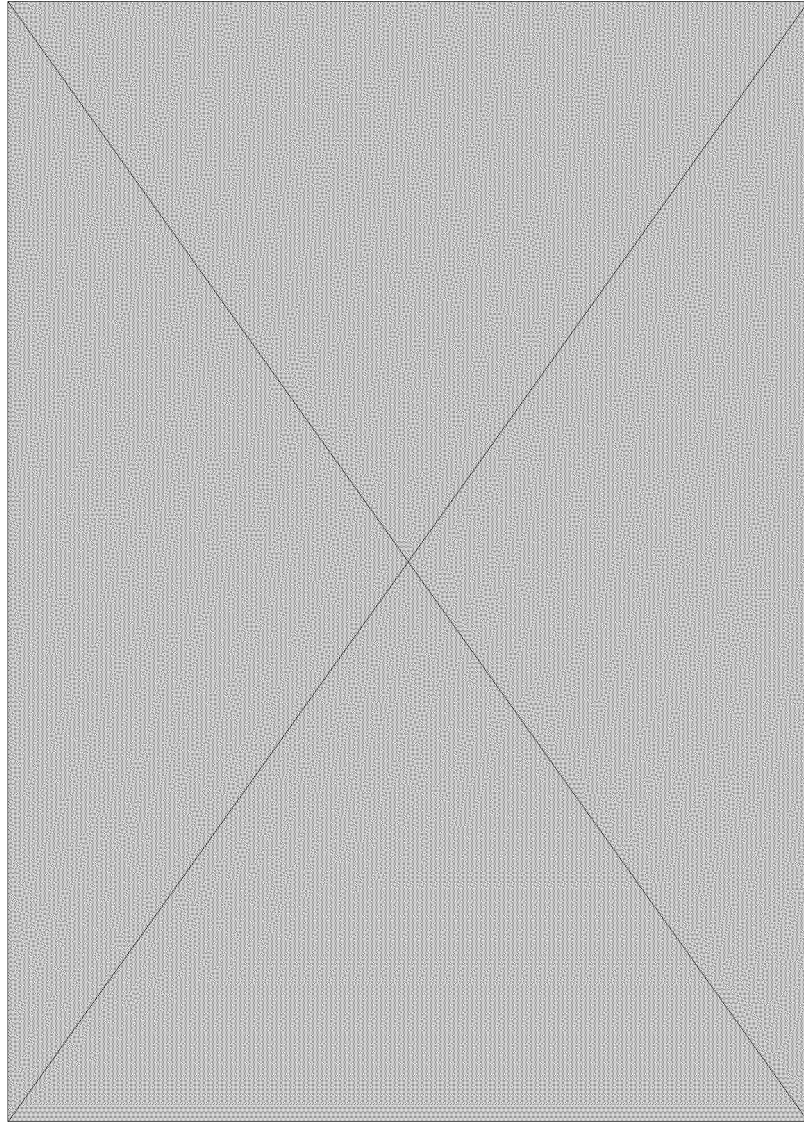
