To Members of the Metallic Lead Products Divisions

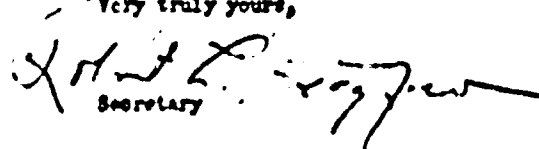
The November, 1950 issue of CHEMICAL ENGINEERING will contain a special 48-page report on construction materials used in the chemical industries. Each of seventeen construction materials is evaluated for each of twenty common and corrosive chemicals. Lead will be prominent among the construction materials covered, all of the data used in the report having been furnished by the Lead Industries Association at the request of CHEMICAL ENGINEERING.

The report is based on the articles which have been contributed to the "Corrosion Forum" section of CHEMICAL ENGINEERING since 1946. All previous contributions have been brought up to date and nine new corrosives added which had not appeared in the "Corrosion Forum." The following corrosives are covered in the report, at least so far as lead is concerned:
