SUBJECT: METALLIC LEAD PRODUCTS DIVISION MEETING

The Metallic Lead Products Division of the Lead Industries Association is sponsoring a one-day meeting at the Biltmore Hotel, New York City, on Tuesday, March 16, 1948, to discuss hygiene and metal supply problems.
